

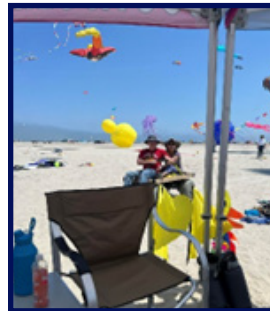
38th Annual Wildwoods International Kite Festival

The Treasure reported that the club's account balance is \$8188.03 at the end of June, and now a membership of 107!

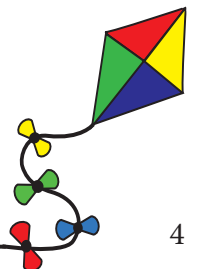

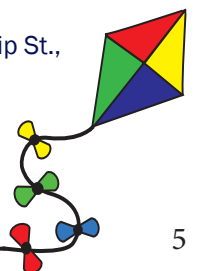

MARYLAND INTERNATIONAL KITE FESTIVAL

It all began for me 24 years ago when I met my husband. He showed me a part of the world I had never seen. I was unaware of the beauty that I was about to see. He booked a trip to Ocean City, MD and we stayed at the Paradise Hotel on the board walk. Corner top room facing south so I had a view of the beach.

Early morning came and Trip made me some coffee so we could both watch the sunrise together, (little did he know how important that was to me then) and invited me to sit outside with him on the balcony. It was a beautiful sunrise with a warm gentle breeze, when out of the corner of my eye I spotted something on the beach that was black, long and big, it was there for quite some time. I wasn't sure what I was looking at. As I focused on the "blob", it started moving gracefully. Then up in the sky it went, I looked in amazement! I said, "a kite", the only kite I knew was a diamond kite which I often flew with my brothers to see who could go the highest. He said, "yes, a kite, it's probably about 90 ft long or more. After many years of kite flying and getting older, we decided to invest in an electric cart to make our trips easier on and off the beach. When you have large inflatable kites and you stuff several in a compression bag, it gets rather heavy as Mike Dallmer can attest too.

As we have learned over the years, pre-planning is essential to the success of a good time at the kite festival. Looking at the weather a couple of days before, reviewing anticipated wind speeds, how far a walk it is from your car to the flying field, is it going to be hot or cold? Do I have the kites packed for that weather and how many, and of course what is the inside cubic feet of your vehicle that you are packing? All the questions needed to be answered before a 4-hour journey to your kiting destination. This also helps your family when they too are coming, but they have a 6.5-hour drive.

With all that said, I always leave the kite selection to Trip when planning for a fly of any kind. He will always ask what I would like to fly, but as you may know the last few years I have not been as active as I used to be, so I give him a few suggestions and then I proceed with the ground

display since that is much easier for me. So, I leave it to my husband's trusted hands.

Once the selections are made, we start to fill the van. That's when I step in, I am an organize freak and tend to be claustrophobic. I wonder if any of you feel the same way when going to a festival? In my mind, the fewer the bags the better, so it looks neater, but I also understand we need kites for a full week. This is where the compression bags come in. We stuff them with about 20 smaller bags inside then squish them down as much as possible. I'm sure this has to be a little bit OCD but my husband is kind enough to stick with my plan. You know... happy wife... and all.

After we think we have everything we need, here is what the side door looks like and the back when we are complete and this includes my Nespresso machine for my room along with a few bags of clothing for a week for each of us, and of course, I never forget my fan since I



can never get the room cold enough. By the way, this also has an electric cart in the back of the van, so I say... a job well done.

Now off to the MIKE Fest in

Maryland. I am so excited since it has been quite a few years since we have been there and the whole family is joining us from Cortland/Binghamton, NY



area. Our good friends who we love to fly with, Tim and Deb Allen, will be there! In addition to the family, I look forward to catching up with Jo-Ann Rasmussen and Rich Miller, Joyce and Jeff King, Jay Knerr, and Mike Van Meers, just to name a few.

We had great weather the whole time, one day it was a tad bit cold but sunny, however, it certainly never deterred the kite flying! It was so fun to experience this beach again and have fun with family and friends. Our grandchildren Landon and Holden love the big kites and their favorites were Sonic and Pikachu, Bulbasaur, Charmander and Squirtle.

I really like flying with these friends as we fly “cooperatively”, there are never any territory wars. The best festivals (like this one) are when we are just flying, no mandatory commitments or extra responsibilities. We just want to put beautiful kites in the air and watch the beautiful colors come to life and dance. 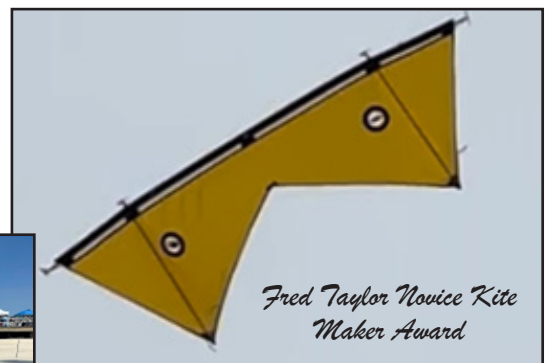

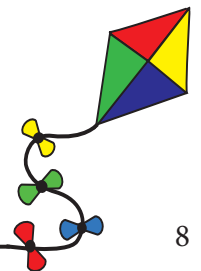

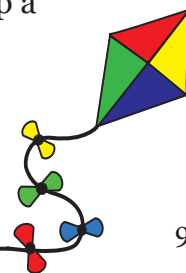

THESE ARE FREAKS!

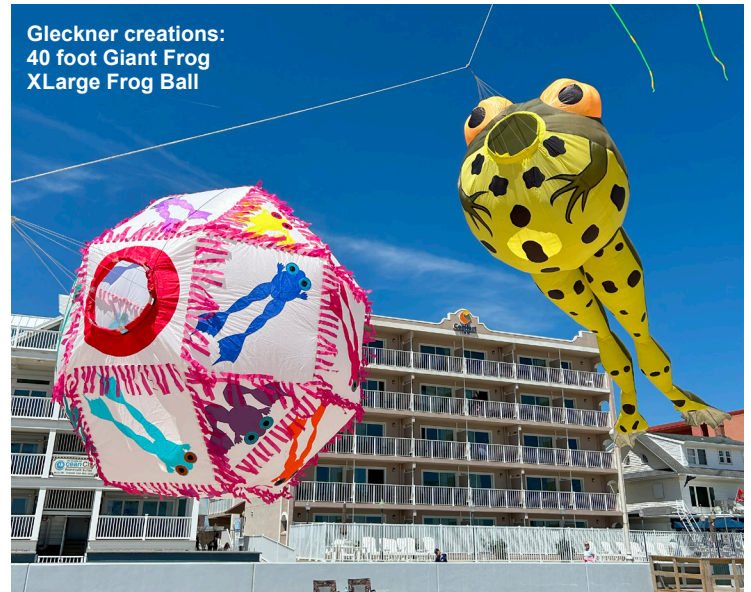
When I first started in kite flying I didn't know much about line laundry until I met Cheryl Gleckner on the field at Sunfest many years ago.

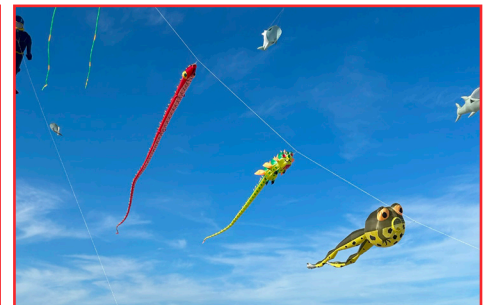
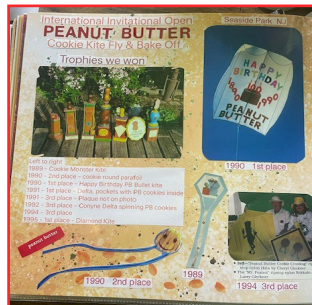

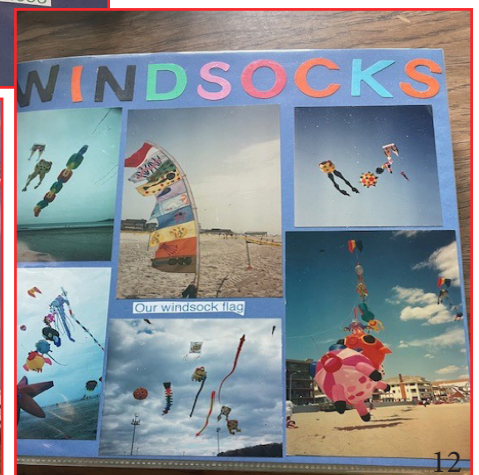
